

Title	Online display
Brief description of clip	This collection of video clips was made by Higher Education students in Blaise Pascal University, Clermont Ferrand, France. They are all learning English and chose a favourite recipe which they explain and demonstrate making.
Difficulty rating of production (easy/intermediate/complex)	intermediate to complex
Recommended CEFR level	A2+
Technical details	The video clips, once made are uploaded to a video hosting site such as Youtube and grouped as a playlist. The URL for the playlist is then turned into a QR code using an online generator. The resultant image can be printed and shared online. Scanning the code with a QR scanner on a smartphone will then playback the videos.
Suggestions (preparation/pre and post activities)	This is a nice way to draw together and share work done by different groups across institutions. You could agree with your group on a target audience, for example young learners of the language and share the QR codes on postcards with a nearby school. Follow up activities could be language based, brief thank you for sharing notes for example.
Ideas for application in different contexts	If you would like to make an interesting wall display for a classroom you could import images of student work on different themes and then create a playlist QR code for each one. Cover a section of the wall in QR codes and encourage visitors to explore them using QR readers on mobile phones or tablets.
