

Title	Pecha Kucha event memories
Brief description of clip	Students create a video clip with pictures, videos, interviews and bloopers/outtakes with classmates and teachers about a specific project done in class or a special event which took place at school. This is an excellent way to reflect on the learning process (especially through the interviews) and a good keepsake for students which they love having, watching and sharing. It is also useful to be used with future students so that they see the work done by “real” people like them. Bloopers and outtakes are really funny and add enjoyment to the final product.
Difficulty rating of production (easy/intermediate/complex)	intermediate to complex
Recommended CEFR level	B1+
Technical details	Encourage capture of key moments of your event, perhaps photos or created artefacts to be using in the video. This sort of video can be as basic or complicated as best fits the time, the resources available and the IT skills from students.
Suggestions (preparation/pre and post activities)	You have a visit from some native speakers or you have arranged a trip for your language learners. Make sure that you get the greatest impact from this activity by planning how to capture it and providing opportunities after the event to reflect upon the learning involved. You could choose certain students to act as event photographers or reporters and then use an editing team to prepare the final video.
Ideas for application in different contexts	Younger students can take pictures and video record the interviews during the event. With a little support from the teacher they can create a simple/basic video clip. Basic video clips with short interviews or question/answers, giving basic information and short sentences. At a higher level students can plan and carry out the whole project by themselves: take pictures, video record and video editing using simple editing programmes working in teams.
