

Title	Role playing an exam scenario
Brief description of clip	A teacher and student are working through the first stage of the First Certificate Exam. The questions have been written into PowerPoint and then uploaded into Present.Me. Present.Me allows a webcam and voice to be added to the PowerPoint and then shared on the internet or embedded.
Difficulty rating of production (easy/intermediate/complex)	easy to intermediate
Recommended CEFR level	A1+
Technical details	The questions need to be written into a PowerPoint presentation and then added into Present.Me. The webcam and voice is then recorded by clicking a button which activates the user's webcam and microphone. The recordings can then be shared on the internet or embedded into a blog, wiki or Moodle site etc.
Suggestions (preparation/pre and post activities)	It is a good idea to first go through the section of the exam that you want to role play. Students can work in pairs with one student being the examiner and the other student answering the questions. In pairs the students can simply write the questions into a PowerPoint slide and then upload them into Present.Me. They can make the recordings as often as they like before they are happy with their recording and then save it to the system. Students can review each other's work. Students can be put into pairs and asked to peer review or even self-evaluate. It is a good idea to provide the marking scheme or train the students before you get them to do any peer/self-evaluation work.
Ideas for application in different contexts	Present.Me is a simple tool to use and can offer lots of options to the teacher. Since the tool is free, you can also get your students to create recordings. Students or teachers can upload PowerPoint presentations or Google Docs and then add their voice and webcam to them. So lots of options for creating content for Blended Learning or Flipped Classroom scenarios. Students can

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	<p>add all sorts of things into their PowerPoint presentation like pictures, diagrams, graphs etc and teachers can do the same. Students can work in pairs or even in groups of 3 but you need to strategically place the webcam.</p>
